



# The Jewish Medical Tradition: From the Bible to the Recent Past

## Course Description

How many of us have wondered why so many Jews have pursued careers in medicine? This course begins with a search for answers to that common question. We will address a variety of factors that have led to millennia of significant Jewish involvement in medical practice. We will consider, for example, the roles of religion, politics, and economics, through discussion of both famous (e.g., Maimonides and Freud) and lesser-known historical figures. We will also look beyond individuals to consider how diseases and specialties have come to be labelled “Jewish,” and we will examine Jewish doctors’ confrontation with, and responses to, prejudice.

## Learning Objectives

1. Identify factors that led to a significant presence of Jews in medicine
2. Recognize the many understandings of “Jewish” in connection with this history
3. Situate the heritage of Cedars-Sinai and its Jewish doctors in the larger narrative of Jews in medicine
